TRANSFER: HIGHLIGHTS

The SC Technical College System offers the most accessible, affordable and relevant pathway to a four-year degree through guaranteed transfer partnerships.



South Carolina technical colleges are a **destination of choice** for students seeking to earn a bachelor's degree through transfer.



There are 21 systemwide transfer agreements with 19 institutional partners creating direct pathways to four-year degrees for associate degree graduates from all 16 technical colleges within the System, regardless of geography.



The System supports the legislative proviso that would create guaranteed pathway to all state four-year institutions for Associate in Arts (AA) and Associate in Science (AS) graduates. From the 2022-2023 academic year, that's **2,958** graduates across the System.



Average annual tuition at a SC technical college is about 36% of the average annual tuition at a four-year instituition.






VISION STATEMENT



CCU Culture

History

- In 1954 fifty-three students enrolled, and were taught by a handful of part-time faculty, with classes meeting after hours in Conway High School.
- In 1958 the first five graduates were awarded associate degrees.
- ➤ In 1993 South Carolina Legislature passes legislation establishing Coastal Carolina University as an independent, public institution with an enrollment of around 4,500 students.
- In 2023 undergraduate and graduate programs enroll a total of 10,829 students.
